The Faculty of Social Sciences welcomes applications for **two** tenure-track position (at any rank) in its Graduate School of Public and International Affairs. The Faculty of Social Sciences comprises nine departments, schools and institutes, offering undergraduate, Master's and doctoral programs in both English and French. With over 7,000 students, 250 full-time professors, and a wide array of programs and research centers, the Faculty of Social Sciences plays a key role at the heart of the University of Ottawa.

Established in 2007, the Graduate School of Public and International Affairs counts over 25 dedicated faculty and 12 affiliated practitioners. It offers a multidisciplinary Master's degree for students interested in pursuing careers related to public and international affairs in national or international institutions. The program focuses on training students to work as advisors, analysts, or managers in government or in private or non-governmental organizations and students can specialize in the study of public policy, international affairs or development studies. The program is also designed for students seeking careers in journalism, think tanks, and government relations in the private sector or who wish to pursue doctoral studies.

One Full-Time Faculty Position (at any rank) in the field of human rights

For this position, in addition to teaching in the GSPIA, the successful applicant will also have a portion of her/his teaching load in the Faculty of Social Sciences' Conflict and Human Rights program, an elite undergraduate multidisciplinary program dedicated to the combined study of human rights, international conflicts and security.

For this position, we are looking for candidates with expertise in the field of human rights. While all candidates with expertise in this area will be considered and are encouraged to apply, we are especially interested in candidates with expertise in one of the following areas:

International organizations, international law and human rights;

Human rights and transitional justice.

One Full-Time Faculty Position (at any rank) in public policy

In addition to teaching in the GSPIA, the successful applicant will have a portion of her/his teaching load in one of the other academic units of the Faculty of Social Sciences.

We are looking for candidates with expertise in one of the following areas:

Comparative public policy (industrialized countries);

The policy-making process.

Duties

- Teach at the undergraduate and graduate levels (2/2 load)

- Supervise Master's and Ph.D. students
- Conduct research and publish
- Participate in academic and administrative activities
- Perform other activities as specified in the collective agreement

Qualifications

Hold a Ph.D. in any relevant field (candidates who are close to completing a Ph.D. could be considered)

Demonstrate excellence or the potential for excellence in teaching and research

Possess a strong publication and research track record

Experience working in government or in a non-governmental organization is an asset

Bilingualism

The University of Ottawa is a bilingual institution, and all professors in the Faculty of Social Sciences must be actively bilingual (French and English) to gain tenure. The University offers second-language training to staff members and their spouses.

Hiring conditions and salary

These are set by the current collective agreement. Tenure-track positions are also subject to budget approval.
